

STATE HOUSE COMMISSION

The State House Commission created by the New Jersey Legislature in 1953, controls the sale and leasing of state owned properties. After the lessee and the manager of the property (such as the Division of Parks and Forestry or the Division of Fish and Wildlife) have agreed to the terms of a lease agreement, the lease has to be approved by the State House Commission.

Commission Members

The State House Commission consists of the Governor, who shall be the presiding officer, the State Treasurer, and the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting and two members of the Senate appointed by the President and two members of the General Assembly appointed by the Speaker no more than one of either group of two being of the same political party or their alternates. Each alternate for an appointed member shall also be a member of the Senate or General Assembly appointed by the President or Speaker, as appropriate, and shall have full voting powers when required to attend commission meetings.
